

CHALK CREEK RUN + PLUS + MEMORIAL TRIP TO MONTPELIOR, ID.

Chalk Creek Run Saturday, May 14, 2016

We're off again to drive some twisty twolanes in nice spring weather with a nearly freeway-free route. **This Saturday** will be our Chalk Creek Valley Run. The weather this weekend is predicted to be perfect for LBC's; Evanston with a high of 71 and 0% chance of rain.

Basically, the run is from the Hogle Zoo in SLC, up Emigration Canyon and on to Coalville. Hwy 65 is open so we can go over Big Mountain to East Canyon and on to Henefer and Coalville all on two lane with little traffic. There's a drain and gain in Henefer at "Grumps." Then on through Echo to Coalville (at the Chevron on Main at about 11:30) where we can meet with others from Park City area and elsewhere.

From Main Street and 100 North (Chalk Creek Road) Coalville we will then head all the way up Chalk Creek valley on a lovely low traffic road. There is a short stretch (about 5 miles) of well-maintained but unpaved road that leads from Chalk Creek valley to the paved road into Evanston. We can do a drain and gain at the Flying J in Evanston then a short, downhill I-80 run to exit 178 and the original two lane (paved) Lincoln Highway and down to red rock Echo Canyon along the toe of the cliffs. Echo Canyon has a lot of history including the transcontinental railroad, Pony Express route, the Lincoln Highway, and the unused cliff-top battlements left over from a disagreement between Utah and the US government in the form of the US army.

After that a leisurely run downhill on I-84 along the Upper Weber River to Taggert's may be in order.

Let's meet at Hogle Zoo around 9:30 for a 10am departure.


Memorial Weekend Run May 28-30, 2016


Route Map for Chalk Creek Run




Page 8 British Motoring Miscellaneous Stuff...
